Report on New India Literacy Programme Week

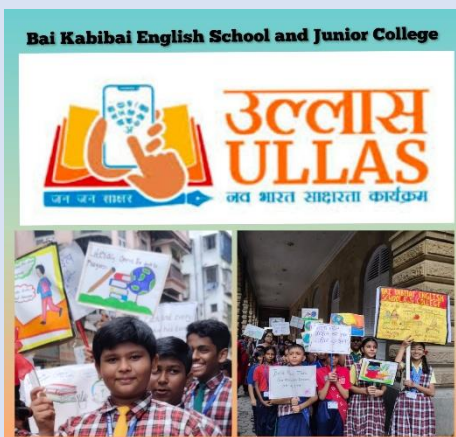

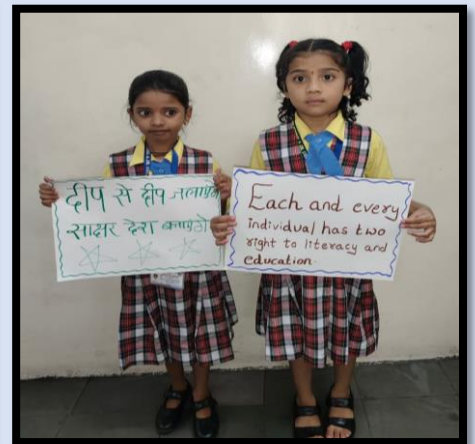
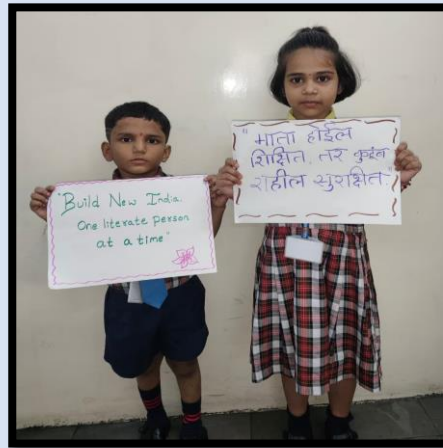
As part of the nationwide initiative to promote literacy and awareness, our school actively observed the **New India Literacy Programme Week** from **1st to 8th September 2025**. The **New India Literacy Programme Week** began with the introduction of the "**Ullas – Navbharat Saksharta Karyakram**" to all teachers, outlining its vision, objectives, and strategies for implementation. 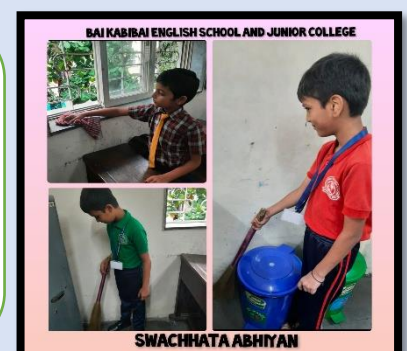


18th September 2025 – Swachhta/Cleanliness Pledge

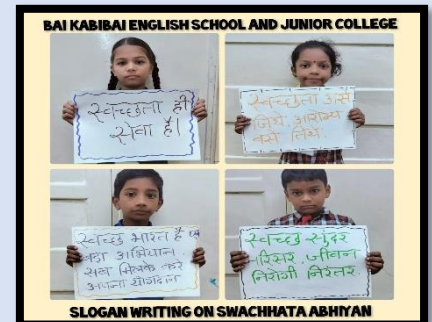
22nd September 2025 – Plantation Drive

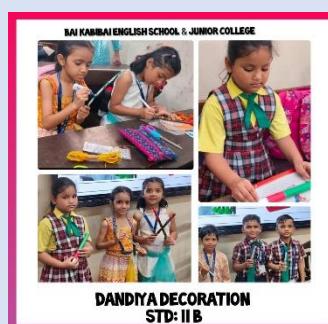
WORKSHOP ON FIRE SAFETY

GLOBAL HANDWAHING DAY

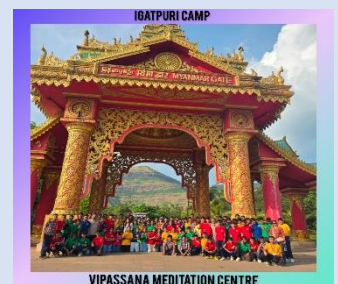
